Sisters Hospital is a 467 bed acute care facility located in Buffalo, NY. It was established by the Daughters of Charity of St. Vincent DePaul in 1848. In 2009, Sisters merged with St. Joseph Hospital in Cheektowaga, NY. Sisters is a medical teaching hospital affiliated with the University of Buffalo. It offers medical and surgical inpatient care, a neo-natal intensive care nursery, labor and delivery unit, ICU/CCU, and a Piver Center for Women. The Spiritual Care Department includes three staff chaplains, a hospital priest and five full-time Chaplain Residents.

The St. Joseph's Campus is a suburban community hospital serving the needs of residents living in and around Cheektowaga, NY. It provides traditional hospital services, outpatient surgery and specialty care centers for wound healing and sleep health. St. Joseph's has a newly renovated Bariatric/Metabolic Program and Therapy (Occupational and Physical) center. The Spiritual Care Department there includes one full-time chaplain, one per diem chaplain and the services of a hospital priest.

The St. Catherine Labouré Health Care Center is a skilled nursing and subacute rehabilitation facility for patients living with a diagnosed condition or requiring medical supervision. The facility is located on the Sisters of Charity Hospital site on Main Street in Buffalo. The physicians, nurses, aides, and specialists at St. Catherine Labouré work with each resident to develop a care plan that best suits their needs and supports overall health. St. Catherine's provides the following service programs: Assistance with Daily Living Activities, HeartStrong Subacute Rehabilitation, Skilled Nursing for Seniors and Subacute Rehabilitation.

LIFE /PACE Programs

LIFE – Living Independently for Elders – is Catholic Health's PACE, or Program of All-inclusive Care for the Elderly. This is an adult care program for participants that still live at home, but may also be in need of more supervised care. LIFE offers both recreational and social activities for its participants. This allows adults to maintain a healthy and engaging lifestyle, while receiving personal care and supervision during the day. The Catholic Health team coordinates all medical care for participants of the LIFE program. Primary care services are provided by an on-site physician who is available at both of our locations. For comfort and convenience, medical services may also be provided in the participant's home or at an off-site location. Transportation to and from medical appointments is included.
