Through Mentor-Mentee Learning Forum

(BUFFALO, N.Y.) April 30, 2019 – Mercy Hospital Foundation co-hosted a Mentor-Mentee Learning Forum with the AstraZeneca HealthCare Foundation to advance efforts to improve heart health with five other nonprofit organizations facing similar challenges in their communities.

Mercy Hospital Foundation's *Heart Smart for Life* program at the Mercy Comprehensive Care Center has helped ensure vulnerable populations at risk in Buffalo have access to nutrition education, free health screenings, wellness programs, and other resources focused on preventing heart disease. The Mercy Hospital Foundation is one of 11 nonprofit organizations nationwide to receive a grant from the AstraZeneca HealthCare Foundation's *Connections for Cardiovascular Health*SM program to help improve heart health through community-based initiatives.

During the Mentor-Mentee Learning Forum, Mercy highlighted their successful program, *Heart Smart for Life*, to the Foundation's new Grant Awardees from South Dakota, Mississippi and Illinois and their mentors, repeat Grant Awardees from West Virginia and Michigan. The program also provided opportunities for Mercy, the mentors and mentees to engage in peer-to-peer learning and workshops led by evaluation and communications experts to help each other enhance and sustain their programs. In addition, they learned how to share their successful approaches for developing and delivering impactful community health programs with other groups across the country.
