In collaboration with Catholic Medical Partners, we are providing patients with timely access to safe, coordinated, high quality care.



- improve the patient experience

Using this guideline, we are strengthening our medical mission, while reaffirming our spiritual mission.



Here are just a few metrics by which we are gauging our progress and success:

- Our exceptional value we are approximately 15% less expensive across all payers, and in some instances 20-30% less expensive for Medicare and Medicaid patients.
- Our bond rating has been upgraded to Triple B+, an unprecedented accomplishment for our system.

- Population Health Management programs are underway for both Medicare and Medicaid patients.
- ER visits increased by 1,000 new visits per month.
- Our quality rankings continue to be among the highest in the region.
- Interest from local physicians wishing to join our system continues.
- We are bringing our care closer to neighboring communities, expanding and opening access to our specialized care in all eight Western New York counties.
- Our Home Care network is growing, having been granted a contract to provide clinical services in Niagara County.
- In partnership with Niagara University, 22 Catholic Health registered nurses graduated from a special program to obtain their bachelor's degree.
- Patient experience metrics continue to trend in positive directions across all of our facilities.
- 90% of all Catholic Medical Partners physicians are using electronic medical records, one of only 69 provider networks in the country to meet this level of distinction.



Healthcare reform aims to provide patients with the best care, while stemming the tide of rising costs. Long before the government proposed sweeping changes in how healthcare is paid for and delivered, Catholic Health was taking proactive steps toward becoming a high performing health system. By investing in electronic medical records technology; creating Patient Centered Medical Homes; launching our First Choice self-funded health plan; and building a seamless network of care, Catholic Health and Catholic Medical Partners are blazing new trails to improve healthcare in our country.

In April 2012, the federal government chose us to be one of only 27 health systems in the nation to serve as an Accountable Care Organization (ACO) – a group of doctors, hospitals and other care providers who give coordinated, high quality care to Medicare patients. We are uniquely qualified in our region to provide this kind of care, which replaces the existing "pay for services" model with a "pay for outcomes" model, rewarding health providers for keeping patients healthy and reducing the overall cost of care.



Catholic Health Continuing & Home Care Foundation

In 2011, this foundation raised \$342,000 to support our Continuing Care and Home Care ministries. An *Understanding Advance Directives* video was produced, to educate the community on the importance of advanced care planning. Sleep chairs were purchased through a grant from the Daughters of Charity of St. Vincent de Paul for use in our long-term care facilities. Work continued on Partners In Rehab's Falls Prevention initiative. A study on frailty was completed and

recently presented at the American Geriatric Society in Seattle, WA. A successful community outreach project – *Cribs for Kids* – supplied 70 new cribs for babies in need.



In 2011, the Kenmore Mercy Foundation raised a total of \$613,450 to support Kenmore Mercy Hospital. The annual *Golf & Wine* event had a net profit of \$156,000, and the *A Tribute to Angels* event raised a net profit of \$133,000. These funds, in addition to the Annual Fund and contributions from the Auxiliary, allowed the foundation to provide Kenmore Mercy Hospital with 72 staff education grants, new monitors for the ICU, and 17 department-specific equipment grants totaling \$117,000.

Catholic Health Mercy Hospital Foundation

In 2011, the Mercy Hospital Foundation generated \$764,000 in revenue to support the mission and ministry at Mercy Hospital of Buffalo. The foundation's third annual *Autumnal* celebration brought together more than 175 friends and supporters, raising \$104,000 to benefit the tiniest patients in Mercy's Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU).

Catholic Health Sisters Hospital Foundation

In 2011, the Sisters Hospital Foundation raised funds and awareness for the surgical programs at its three sites: Sisters of Charity Hospital, the St. Joseph Campus and the Sisters Ambulatory Surgical Center. The annual Spring Gala, *A Royal Evening in Black & White*, raised \$116,410, while the annual Golf Tournament at the Country Club of Buffalo had a net profit of \$61,534. A successful Annual Giving Campaign raised an additional \$448,520.
