## Catholic Health Hosts Knowledge Harvest Event to Provide Information on Nurse Residency Programs for New and Graduate Nurses

Just as physicians complete medical residencies to gain competencies in their chosen field of practice, nurse residencies are great way for new nurses to grow their clinical skills as they transition from students to experienced practitioners. Catholic Health's fully-paid and accredited Nurse Residency Program is designed for graduate nurses interested in working in specialize clinical settings such as emergency care, intensive care, mother/baby care, and medical/surgical services.
